Graduate!CT recently attended the Adult College Completion Network conference in Denver, October 19-21. The conference was hosted by the Western Interstate Commission **ADULT** of Higher Education (WICHE) and the Lumina Foundation, and it brought COLLEGE together over 40 organizations all committed to working with adults who COMPLETION want to return to college and finish degrees.

The conference gave us a chance to learn what's happening all across the country to locate, recruit and help adults with some college credit and no degree go back to school and finish what they started. We want to convert these 'stop-outs' to 'come-backers'.



The Lumina Foundation's 'Big Goal' is to increase the percentage of Americans with college degrees to 60% by 2025. To meet this national goal we are going to have to get 278,781 million adults, aged 25-64, college degrees every year until 2025. But don't worry, in Connecticut we only have to get an additional 1,835 adults their degrees every year until 2025.
